US HISTORY TIMELINE 1600S-1800S

- Create a Timeline that contains the events at the bottom.
- For each event, write the 5W's. (Who? What? When? Where? Why?)
- For Washington, Adams and Jefferson's presidencies, label them with the year that they came into office. The events underneath each president need to be summarized in a sentence or two instead of writing the 5W's.

Hints:

- * To make nice neat labels, create slides (one per event) and print out the slides as a handout with 6 slides. Cut the slides out and glue them on your timeline. If you are totally lost by this, come see me and I'll show you!
- * Space the events on your timeline according to year!! You should see that there is HUGE gap between 1620 and the events of the Revolutionary War. This gap helps show how calm and good things were until after the French & Indian War.
